ARTICLES

Article 3: Shall the District raise and appropriate the sum of \$26,000,000 (gross budget) for the Sunapee Central Elementary School Modernization Project, which includes renovation of the existing building, construction of a new addition, site improvements, and equipment and furnishings; and to authorize the issuance of \$26,000,000 of bonds or notes in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (RSA Chapter 33); and to authorize the School Board to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the date, maturities, interest rate, and other details of such bonds or notes; and to raise and appropriate an additional sum of \$659,931 from taxation for debt service payments due on such bonds or notes during the 2019-2020 fiscal year; and to authorize the School Board to accept on behalf of the District any federal, state, or private funds that may become available to fund the project and to use such funds to reduce the amount of bonds or notes issued for the project. (A 3/5 ballot vote is required.)
(The Sunapee School Board recommends approval.)

Article 4: Shall the District raise and appropriate as an operating budget, not including appropriations by special warrant articles and other appropriations voted separately, the amounts set forth on the budget posted with the warrant, or as amended by vote of the first session, for the purposes set forth therein, totaling Twelve Million, Five Hundred Six Thousand, Seven Hundred Eighty Three Dollars (12,506,783)? Should this article be defeated, the default budget shall be Twelve Million, Four Hundred Forty Three Thousand, Six Hundred Nineteen Dollars (\$12,443,619), which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the District or by law; or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only.

Article 5: Shall the District approve the cost items included in the collective bargaining agreement reached between the Sunapee School Board and the Sunapee Teachers Association, which calls for the following increases and benefits totaling:

The costs for the years of the agreement beyond the upcoming 2019-2020 fiscal year will be included in the operating budget proposal each of those years.
